

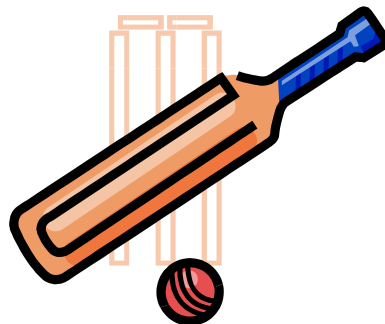

## UNDER 10's SEASON 2003/2004 IN REVIEW

We started our season together with a good mix of kids that had played last year and some new members to our team. The boys were really easy to coach as they all got on well. All of the parents also made it easy to run things this year as they all were willing to help out. I would have been lost without their help and I thank them all. A special thank you to Jim Gooley and Joe Conolly who helped me this year.

Together we all saw some great cricket played from our team and to only lose two games all year was a great achievement by the boys. I myself like to see them win but to see the smiles that all of the boys had on their faces from time to time throughout this year was my highlight. All of the boys' achievements are listed below in the stats report:

### **Batting**

We had a top score of 29 this year scored by Lachlan Wassall who also had the most not outs with ten this year. The highest run scorer this year was Paul Gooley who scored 204 runs for the year from 16 times at bat and a retirement of only 15 runs each time he went out to bat. They were the top scores but I also would like to mention all of the others who tried hard all year. Cameron Davis had not played cricket until this season and he opened and scored 6 not out including a great hook shot for 4. Jason Corcoran, in a tough game, opened for us and scored 11 not out but batted for 13 overs. Luke Winter and Jackson Davis who were in their first year of cricket, both made it all the way to the mighty 15 runs, well done to all those boys. Not to forget all the other boys Hayden Wassall, Hayden Cole, Jacob Magner, Brendan Sweeney, Ben Conolly, and Daniel MacGregor all who had a mighty year with the bat.

### **Bowling**

Our bowling for this year was just as good as our batting with the team taking a total of 101 wickets for the year for a total of 1342 runs scored against us and that was from 19 games which averages out to only 70 runs per game and 2.35 runs per over so top effort boys. One thing that went against us this year with the ball was all of the wides and no balls that we bowled and that total came to 620 runs, so take that amount off the runs scored and it is really down so we still need to do some work in that area of our game. Our top wicket taker for this year was Paul Gooley who took 16 wickets with only 96 runs scored, closely followed by Hayden Cole and Hayden Wassall with 12 and 11 wickets each. The top maiden bowler this year was Brendan Sweeney with 10 maidens, great effort to these boys.

All of the other members of our team Ben, Cameron, Daniel, Lachlan, Jacob, Jason, Jackson and Luke at times throughout the year did a great job for us with the ball by taking wickets and keeping runs down.

In closing, the 2003/04 report, I hope that I have turned the light on inside all of the boys and that they have a love for this great game of cricket and will stay with the game for as long as they can play.
