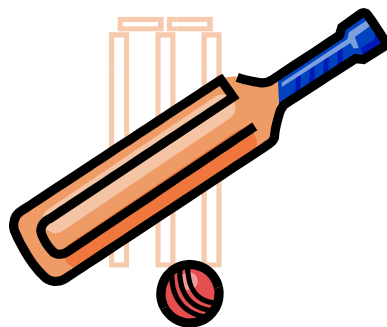

To all players, family members and friends,

Season 2004/05 was another triumph in the clubs relatively short, yet rapidly growing history.

As most of you would know – this year was the year Bligh Park Cricket Club officially became the largest club in the HDCA. We fielded a total of 13 sides, comprising of 6 Juniors and 7 Senior teams.

This is a great accomplishment for the club, which doesn't come easy. This has come from many of years of foundation building and dedication from a great array of people. It's also satisfying that the club is growing through it's members returning year after year and also bring new members to the club.

We broke our club record with the number of premierships won in one season, with a total of 3 trophies coming our way. Our Under 11's recorded the clubs 2nd only ever Junior premiership, while our 3rd and 4th Grade side showed the way in the Seniors.

We were proud to field our first ever 1st Grade side this season. In doing this, we fielded a very competitive team, with them making the finals – an excellent debut. We also created HDCA history by fielding two Senior teams in the one grade (7th Grade).

This year, like previous, we ensured we kept our social content highly on offer, with our two Trivia Nights proving a great success, along with the Super-8's, with the Ron Airey lead 3rd Grade taking the honours. Throw in our Junior and Senior Christmas parties and various less formal social events, typically at the Clarendon Tavern, we made sure we all kept mingling off the field. We are looking at expanding our social calendar further next year, including Junior Gala days and Sportsmans Luncheon.

This was also the first year that the club was able to offer a turf pitch to it's players, at the University of Western Sydney (UWS) Richmond Campus. This was the first time in almost 10 years the pitch had been used and proved to be a handful to bring up to standard. Appreciation goes to both Mark Ross and Steve Clark for their extensive time and efforts. The Club is spending this off season starting the pitch from scratch to remove the issues that existed with the pitch last season. We will be aiming to have the best deck in the district – so all is looking good for next season onwards.

Sponsors play a massive role in the success of the club. Without sponsors, we'll either be paying a fortune for the privilege or would have limited ways to expand. Windsor RSL has shown great faith in Bligh Park Cricket Club and has helped considerably when required – something which we are extremely grateful off. BPCC Seniors also got to play in the new Microfibre shirts, proudly sponsored by Hogs Breath Café Clarendon. AMP/PLM Financial Services sponsored our Trivia Nights, along with a great range of local businesses which helped with prizes. Many of these came from the massive amounts of time and effort of the committee, with many thanks going to Ross Thompson who was instrumental in a great majority of these eventuating.

1st Grade – Year in Review

This Season 2004-2005 saw Bligh Park Cricket Club introduce its first 1st Grade side since its inception into the HDCA competition.

With 8 new faces to the side and 5 from the previous winning 2nd Grade competition, our team was extremely experienced & confident for a successful season.

We started the season on a high with a convincing win over Pitt Town, but lost our way in the next 3 rounds with losses to North Richmond, Richmond and a wash outs against Freemo and Schofields. Round 6 was another good win against Pitt Town. Parkies put up a good fight against North Richmond in Round 7, even without our Guru batsman, (Danny Apps). Further good wins against Freemo, Richmond, Schofields and Pitt Town cemented 3rd position. Having to win our last game against Schofields to stay in 3rd position, which we did, thanks to our No. 11, Dave Wilton who scored 42 runs to give us a total of 130-odd. Thankfully the bowlers did the job.

Semi-Final: Bligh Park vs Richmond

The day started well with Parkies winning the toss and electing to bat on what looked like a good Northo deck. At 1-0 things were not looking good. Jako gone for a duck, Danny and I steadied the ship until I went for 21, now 2-66, it seemed like we were doing alright. To cut it short, we were bowled out for 100, including 6 ducks. Danny once again came to the Fore with 41. (did Danny write this??? – editor).

Richmond passed our score quite convincingly, having bowled 91 overs at them, they were 5-196.

I would like to congratulate all the boys for the way they applied themselves both on and off the field throughout the season. The sportsmanship and mateship shown was of true character of Bligh Park Cricket Club!! (Quote), “WELL DONE PARKIE DAY!!”

Glen Jacobson (Jako, Glen 20). L/H bat/bowler, solid opening bat, highest score of 34 against Freemo. As his name suggests, always reliable for 20 or 30 runs each match. Glen provides good variety with left arm medium pacers. Took 4 wickets; also kept wickets for most of the year. David Wilton reckons he's the best net bowler in the district, but bowls a little short. Always runs late to the games!! Good allrounder.

Craig Shephard (Shep, Shepo, Captain Serious). L/H bat, R/H bowler. Solid opening bat. Highest score of 29 against Schofields. Under achieved this season with the bat; bowled well on occasions. Best 3-4 against Freemo. Thoroughly enjoyed Captaining – a great bunch of blokes.

Danny Apps (Apps, Appsy, Flapps). R/H bat. Most consistent batsman this season. Hits the ball hard and long. 42 x 4's and 23 x 6's in boundaries. Best performances 97 n.o. against Northo, 81 against Richmond, 83 against Schofields. Part time keeper and Vice Captain. Good team player.

Bill Visocchi (B.J., Billy). R/H bat, R/H bowler. Highest score of 25 n.o against Pitt Town and Schofields. Great team man and specialist fieldsman. Will be hoping for runs next Season. Best bowling figures 1-31 vs Pitt Town.

Ron Denadel (Ron, Dipper, Sandpit). R/H bat; hits the ball very hard. Scored 56 of about 28 balls against Schofields. Well known for his good hands in slips. Enjoys a beer or two after the game. Season Campaigner.

Luke Roberts (Luke, Robo). R/H bat/bowl. Great striker of the ball. Had some great individual performances throughout the year. 3-13 and 36 runs against Pitt Town. 2-14 and 25 against Freemo. 5-19 and 27 vs Schofields and also 57. Solid all-rounder. Always gets that break-through.

Peter Woods (Woodsy, Blocker, Woodo). R/H bat/bowl. Good hitter of the ball. Best performance 31 n.o. vs Richmond, 24 n.o. vs North Richmond. Bowled well throughout the year, taking vital breakthroughs and usually taking another 1 or 2 in quick succession. Good slips fieldsman. Loves a beer after the game. Best figures 3-8 vs Richmond and 3-27 vs Schofields. Had the most golden ducks, contributed a lot to the kitty.

Cheyne Cikoja (Sook). R/H bat/bowl. Known for his hitting power. Best performance with the bat, 18 vs Schofields. Unfortunately o'seas on duty for most of the season. Opens the bowling with good pace and bounce. Best figures 3-27 vs Richmond. Valuable player to have on your side.

Troy Armstrong (Troy, Rodman). R/H bat/bowl. Batted down the order this season due to his workload as a bowler. Highest score of 18 vs Pitt Town and Freemo. Troys bowling performances this season was outstanding. He stepped up from 2nd Grade, bowling a much tighter line, forcing batsmen to make the mistake. He also opened the bowling for most of the season. Best figures include 3-8 vs Pitt Town, 4-24 vs Pitt Town, 3-33 vs Freemo.

Geoff Drury (Geoffrey, Drews, Drury, Silvo). R/H bat/bowl. Geoff always bats 10 or 11; values his wicket probably more so than some of our top order batsmen, with 5 not outs, highest score 15 n.o. Geoff bowled some great spells this season. One that comes to mind was against Schofields where he bowled 45 balls to the same batsman without scoring a single run. 12 overs, 9 maidens 2/12. He beat the bat hundreds of times, with good pace. Great competitor.

David Wilton (Dave, Parkie Day). R/H bat. Dave batted 10 and 11 all year where he batted only 6 times, then savoured his moment of glory for the last Round 15 of the competition. The older Statesman of the side was given an opportunity to open the batting, where he grabbed it with both hands, scoring 42 runs, silencing some of the critics for a brief moment and also winning a \$100 bet from Danny Apps. Hope all the bruises have healed big fella!! Thanks for collecting the fine monies.

Brad Carter (Carts, Silvo). R/H bat/bowler. Not much to tell about his batting – highest score 1. However Carts bowled well in the 5 games he played. Would have loved to have bowled him all season, but overseas work commitments made him unavailable. But figures of 3-19 vs Schofields, 3-33 vs Pitt Town. A real character!!

4th Grade – Year in Review

PREMIERS 2004/05

The first thing I want to write for this years review, is the last sentence I wrote in last years Year Book after our disappointing season in 3rd Grade, which was:

“Next year, we’ll ensure we get 11 full time players on the field and win the comp again.”

To save you having to read through this to find out the result.... we got 11 on the field all year and we won the comp.

A good combination was formed with a mix of us drop outs from last years 3rd Grade side, plus some young, responsible, fit, energetic, responsible, talented, responsible...what am I saying???. last years 3rds plus Nick, Aiden and the Howe boys...! Throw in a couple of casuals and we were cruising!

We always had the true spirit of Cricket in all of our minds (the spirit for a team with an average age around the mid-20’s anyway) – we all ensured that we kept the most important thing that cricket is about – schooners after the game. It was good to see though that two “groups” that came together at the start of the year was able to quickly mould into a unit that enjoyed playing with each other.....

The table at the end of season had Wilberforce a mile in front as undefeated Minor Premiers, with a tight finish with Freemans Reach, Pitt Town and ourselves, who finished 2nd, 3rd and 4th respectively. 5th and 6th were then a mile away from the Top 4 and pretty disappointing to see that North Richmond was one of them.

This year for us was realistically a fairly easy ride. Sure we lost some games and we did come 4th, but we were never out of our league – when we lost we typically fell short by, on average, 10-20 runs. And with those, we typically had a couple of our better players up helping out 1st Grade.

While writing this, I have no idea on the stats of other players from the other teams we played, but I’m guessing that none of our players would take out any individual awards. This isn’t to sound harsh about our players, but just to highlight for us – it wasn’t an individuals performance that got us through the season (it helped us get through some individual games...), but a balance of good performances from a range of players – and this is what proved to be the winning formula throughout the finals.

Geoff Byrnes – The team’s specialist fielder had a great year. Again suffered with the lack of chance to bowl, even with an average of 8.00. Highlight was a magnificent 21 against Northo...

Highlight for him was the great catch in-close in the semi’s that we couldn’t unglue his hands from. Highlight for us was the match against Northo where he spent about 6 hours ready to bat to get a duck within about 4 balls....

Matt Howe – Batted like shit until we actually put him up the order. After having an average of about negative 24.13, he ended up with a pretty good average of +24.13 thanks to Nick not being present. Highlights was his 86 and a cut on the hand from whacking off a fan....

Tim Howe – Rowdy for obvious reason did well to smash his older brother in the pointscore....excellent line and length bowler, he always got the 2 critical wickets each match. Highlight of the season included 28 against Freemo and 4-22 against Wilbo.
