

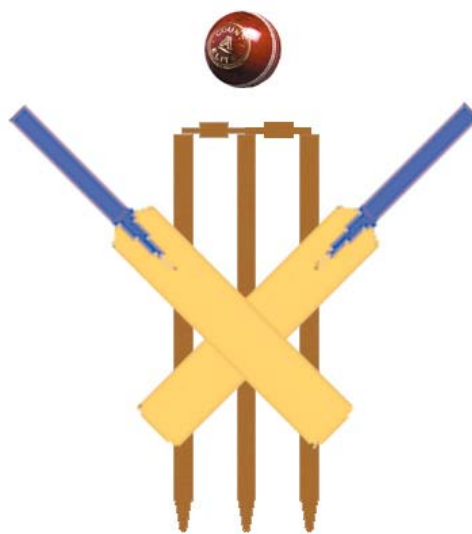

# **UNDER 11'S SEASON 2005-2006 TEAM REPORT**

*- FINALIST -*

The Under 11's had a successful season where they made it to the final, which is always a great experience. Things did not go as we hoped on the day but we fought hard for the entire match never giving up. That is the beauty of cricket, always unpredictable and can change in a moment

We started the cricket season with only 9 players, of those only 5 had played organised cricket previously. In our first game we were beaten quite comfortably. From this humble beginning I thought we were in for a long, tough season where as a team we were going to have to work hard and support each other to succeed. History now shows us that these young cricketers demonstrated great strength of character, both personally and as a team, and were able to become a very competitive cricket side.

Throughout the regular season we played only 2 games with 11 players and half the team were still eligible for the Under 10's. To be placed second at the end of the regular season, then go on to make it to the final was a long way from that first Saturday back in round 1.

We worked hard in all areas - Batting, bowling, fielding running between wickets and concentrating mostly on getting the basics of the game right. They learned about the importance of guarding and protecting their wicket and making the other team work hard to get them out. They also learnt that cricket is a game where you can perform well as an individual, but equally as important is the need to work together as a team to achieve your goals.

For me, as coach, there were two magical games that come to mind. The first was playing against the team who were running second with us at the time – we scored 145 and rolled them for 67 with only 9 players – the effort, desire to win and the support for each other was great to see. The second was the semifinal against Maroota, everything we did worked, we took excellent catches, bowled well and we got them out for 82. We then batted to be 2 for 141 with still 20 overs to be bowled and the top 4 batsmen all retiring, the team was looking very strong in all aspects of the game.

The Under 11's certainly came a long way this season; all the players improved, worked hard and played the game in the right spirit. I was very proud of the team and glad to have had the opportunity to coach them. I believe they learnt a lot about the game and hope they had fun.

Thank you to all the players for your hard work and effort, you are very keen to play and I think if we trained six hours a day you would still want to stay longer.

Thank you also to the parents for getting the kids to training and the games and also with scoring, assisting with training and supporting all the kids, it was greatly appreciated.
