To all players, coaches, team personnel, family members and friends,

Season 2006/07 is a significant milestone for Bligh Park Cricket Club, bringing up its 10th season since its formal inception as BPCC. The club has come a long way over its past 15 or so years, originating from a 'pub side', known as the Royal Exchange then later moving to become Aussie Social. Back then we usually had 1 or 2 senior teams accompanying a Junior team, sometimes two.

Throughout 96/97, with most of the players residing at Bligh Park, a commercial decision was made to relocate the club and to be known as Bligh Park Cricket Club Inc. This was a significant step, maturing the club from the pub days to converge on an area with high population and despite Windsor Leagues nearby, the town officially had no club. It was a move that proved to be a great success.

Over the 10 years, BPCC has grown to become one of the largest clubs in the district. Over the last 5 years, we have averaged over 5 Junior sides and over 6 Senior sides.

This could not have transpired without the hard work and commitment of all the players, parents, coaches, managers, committee, family and friends. To attain a large successful club over a short time, keeping to our core values of getting players participating in the great game of cricket, being played in good spirit while maintaining a healthy club image is a credit to us all.

While on the subject of healthy – we have been in no better shape than we have been this season.

Our Under 10's, who don't play in a formal competition are full of young players full of talent and enthusiasm. They are sure to go far.

Our Under 11's and 12's were high achievers, making the semi-finals after a very good season for them both (Under 11's finishing 2nd, Under 12's finished 3rd after the regular season).

The Under 13's had a good season, finishing 3rd during the regular season. They then made nervous wrecks of everyone watching their semi-final to progress through to the final, going on to win the premiership in style. Rolling the minor premiers for 21 in their first innings, then putting the game out of reach by batting superbly to get 158 shows what talent this young team has.

The Under 16's did do it tough. A team consisting mainly of players who'd be eligible to play Under 16's again next season, they played with courage & never gave up in the toughest age group to play in. We hope they stick together and give the title a shot next year.

The Seniors, who have many current and prior BPCC Juniors also did well. We finished with three teams being semi-finalist. It was a shame that our 1st Grade faced unfortunate circumstances in the middle of their semi-final, while in a very commanding position. First Grade though is shaping up with a number of BPCC's bred Juniors, while Third Grade contained a number of others. It'll be excellent to see this trend continue. We also had a number of our Juniors fill-in, with Joel Tynan a special mention, being one of the youngest players in HDCA history to play 1st Grade.

On behalf of the club, I'd like to thank every one of you for your contribution, not just this season – but throughout the club's history. This includes all the parents/guardians, coaches, managers, assistants, volunteers, committee, family, friends and most of all – the players. We are all proud of the way we're represented and wish everyone a happy off-season and see you next season!!!

Trophy Policy

Bligh Park Cricket Club has for a number of years by policy shared the three major trophies among the top three recipients. The three major trophies are:

- Point Score
- Batting Average
- Bowling Average

As often happens, a team has a certain special individual, who manages to achieve the best in all three categories. In recognition that cricket is a team sport, these trophies are shared, with no one person winning multiple of those awards. Simply the next best eligible player receives the specific reward. The policy exists for the Under 10's through to and including the Under 14's.

The aggregate awards are omitted from this policy and are awarded to the actual winner. Bligh Park Cricket Club feels this is both fair to the team and to the award winners and emphasises BPCC's team philosophy.

The qualification of the awards are in line with the HDCA award policy, but with a modified (lower) cut-off factor for runs scored or wickets taken:

- Applicable to all age-groups:
 - Must have played in more than half of the matches
- Under 10's:
 - Batting: Greater than 100 runs scored
 - Bowling: More than 8 wickets taken
- Under 11's to Under 16's:
 - Batting: Greater than 120 runs scored
 - Bowling: More than 10 wickets

❖ If no-one is eligible, then it is awarded in order of the highest wicket taker or scorer of runs.
